

- C Indeed, everything is for our sake, so that grace, when it has extended to more and more people, may increase thanksgiving to the glory of God.



# Great Bread Auction

### Sunday, March 30, in Williams Family Center You may enter bids before and after the worship service. Bidding will close at 11:50 a.m.

The annual Great Bread Auction is a silent auction of your best breads, cakes, muffins, cookies, pastries, etc. that supports the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) special offering. This offering is the single, largest way that Presbyterians come together every year to work for a better world. All funds raised via the auction are distributed in approximately equal amounts to the following three OGHS Programs:

- (4) Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. 32% of the funds go towards helping people recover from the devastation of natural and human-caused disasters, including support for refugees.
- (5) Presbyterian Hunger Program receives 36% of the funds collected. This program acts to alleviate hunger as well as address the systemic causes of poverty so that all may be fed.
- (6) Self-Development of People receives the remaining 32% of the total collected. This program invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty, and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues.

### How to Participate in the Auction

- Bring your home baked goods to the Williams Family Center on Sunday, March 30. Fill in a bid form with your name and a description of the item. Please prepare a bid form for each item.
- Items will be on display before and after the Worship service in the Williams Family Center.
- Make your bid on the "silent auction form" located beside each item.
- The highest bidder at the close of the auction (11:50 am) settles up and takes the item home.

You can participate by bringing items for the auction and by bidding generously!
