

Good Sam Food requests for March – Bring your food offering to the worship service with you next Sunday, March 9.

Special food requests this month: canned fruits and canned vegetables

Hygiene requests: shampoo

Regular requests: canned fruits, canned vegetables, dry spaghetti, pasta sauce, soup, soda crackers, cereal, peanut butter, canned tuna, and canned chicken.

Volunteers needed to help with gasoline and utility assistance on Mondays and Tuesdays each month until the benevolence funds for the month are exhausted (now \$400). You are asked to be in the church office from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. to go to Mapco around the corner from the church to purchase gas for clients (using church credit card) and to phone a utility company to pay on a client's account (also using church credit card).

The time you are in the office is an opportunity to read, work on your own projects, and/or to use your phone for entertainment. Bethany kindly allows the volunteers to use her office during these hours since she is in her preschool office during that time.

Your volunteering allows Stephen and Martha time to get other work done.
