

#### Items for Basket

2 cans corn 1 small bottle cooking oil 2 cans green beans 1 box instant potatoes 1 can pork and beans 2-pound box Bisquick or cornmeal 2 cans soup cranberry sauce 1 can peaches bag hard candy / stick candy 1 jar applesauce cookies, baked goods 1 jar peanut butter box of crackers (Saltine, Ritz, etc.) 1 can yams a special treat of your choice box of instant rice cranberry, apple or grape juice stuffing mix other items appropriate for a festive dinner box of mac and cheese

Several small cans of fruits and vegetables may be preferable to one large can. Add toiletries such as soap, Kleenex, toilet tissue etc. if you wish. The pre-school is collecting toothpaste.

Hams and fruit for the 2024 baskets are provided from mission funds. Laundry detergent is also provided from mission funds with the help of Presbyterian Women.

#### Important and/or Useful Information based on last year's data:

- -Many shoppers were looking for healthy options, so consider purchasing some low sodium or low sugar items.
- -Chicken Noodle Soup is not popular due to its prevalence at Good Sam throughout the year.
- -Cranberry Juice was the most popular of the juices.
- -Dial and Dove soap were preferred over Ivory and Zest.
- -Crest toothpaste was preferred over Colgate.
- -Shampoo and blankets were popular

# "Gifts of the Magi" coming in January!

January 6 is the Twelfth Day of Christmas, the traditional date on which the Magi arrived giving gifts to the Christ child. Therefore, January seems the perfect time to participate in an activity called "The Gifts of the Magi." We did this activity a couple of years ago, and it has been suggested as a fun activity to do again. So, we will see if there is enough interest to do so.

As a participant in "The Gifts of the Magi," you will be given the name of a First Presbyterian Church "family" (remembering that a "family" can mean a household of one or many). Another participating family will receive your name. To be both a giver and a recipient you must sign up to participate.

During the weeks of January you will take time each day to remember your assigned "family" in prayer. You may surprise them during the month with small gifts or acts of kindness. Some examples: drop off some cookies; write a note of encouragement; take them a casserole or a pot of soup that they can turn into supper after a busy day; meet for a cup of coffee or tea; have lunch together; offer to babysit while they do some shopping; give them a small gift; give a donation to a charitable cause in their name. It really is the thought that counts. Use your imagination for what is suitable for the "family" you have. Another "family" will be doing the same for you!

You may reveal your identity from the very beginning or you can do it as a "secret pal," though keeping your identity secret will be much more difficult if you choose to do some of the suggested activities!

Those wishing to participate will need to sign-up by December 15, so we can give participants the name of the "family" that will be the recipient of their "Gifts" and will allow us to get the activity going at the beginning of January.

"The Gifts of the Magi" promises to be a way of getting to know members of the church family, appreciating and encouraging them, and of brightening January days for both givers and receivers. This activity will extend the message of Christmas throughout the month.
